




### Further perfin information

Further perfin information we signify with the following abbreviations:

- Hr perfins also known on Hradcany stamps (for list of these perfins see the appendix 5, for more information see the catalog [x6]);
- PČ perfins also known on the POSTA CESKOSLOVENSKA 1919 issues (see also chapter 4.1. and the appendix 4);
- SO perfins also known on Czechoslovak stamps with the SO 1920 overprint (we mention the possible occurrence on Polish stamps with the S.O. 1920 overprint only in a note);
- <1883> perfins also known on the Austrian stamp issue 1883 Austrian Empire Coat of Arms (for list of these perfins see the appendix 2);
- Poko (in the 1987 catalog they were marked by the symbol =) this perfin was struck with a machine that counted the stamps, made the perfin, separated it from the roll of stamps, and stuck it on the correspondence (additional information can be found in chapters 4.2. and 4.3., a list of them to be found in the appendix 6);
- X/... multi-perfins are perfins struck by a machine with multiple monograms the individual perfins we mark as types; the number after the slash indicates the number of types of the multi-perfin; in case we as yet do not know the exact number of types, we use the symbol X/? (see also chapter 4.2, and the appendix 7).
